
HUNE empowers and supports families of exceptional children and youth in obtaining a quality public education, so that the students will lead rich, active lives and attain future success.

Based on HUNE's experience, and the input of our partners, we acknowledge that all service should be provided in the family's native language.



In addition, HUNE suggests the following strategies:

- Provide bilingual/bicultural staff members who are fluent in the language and culture that you are serving.
- Offer all information, meetings, and training opportunities in the families' native language.
- Remove barriers to maximize family engagement participation.
- Share information using a variety of modalities, such as social media and messaging apps.
- Empower families through partnering with them in the development of family engagement and family support activities.
- Provide opportunities for families from the same linguistic and cultural background to develop social networks with each other.
- Provide staff with ongoing professional development on cultural and linguistic diversity.
- Family engagement initiatives should be anchored in research based best practices.
- Provide up-to-date guidance and information about Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE).
- Provide families with strategies for supporting their student in the home.
