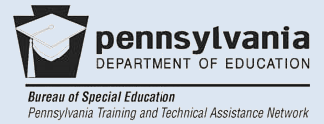




PaPBS Network Facilitator Institute 2017

September 18-19, 2017 – PaTTAN Harrisburg

During this bi-annual event, provisional and independent network facilitators will acquire knowledge and skills regarding the multi-tiered implementation of positive behavior interventions and supports (PBIS) by attending multiple topical breakout sessions. The sessions are designed to promote collaboration and provide facilitators with opportunities to engage in conversations to discuss effective practices and local implementation efforts.

Additionally, Dr. Laura Riffel, former webmaster for the National Technical Assistance Center on Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports sponsored by the Office of Special Education Programs, will be sharing recently developed materials specifically requested through the PaPBS Network to assist with the development of authentic family engagement within the tier 1 implementation of PBIS. She will target her sessions for Early Childhood and School Aged facilitators in separate breakouts.
