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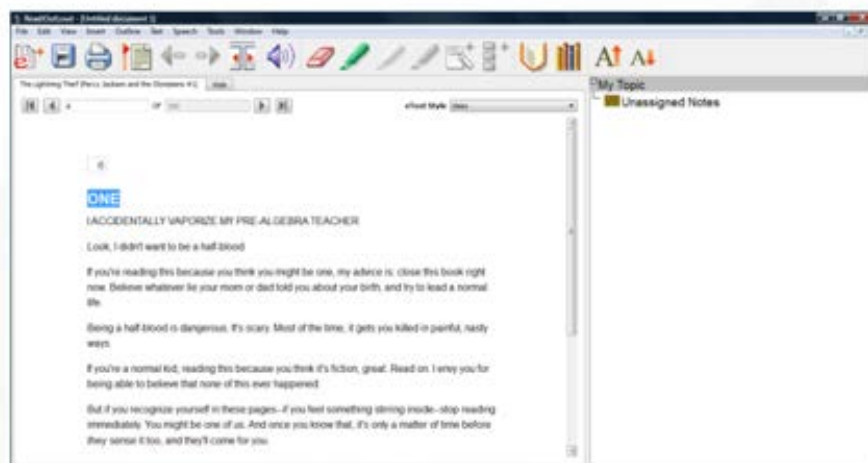
## Opening a Book From Your Computer in ROL

- Double click on the file (.opf)


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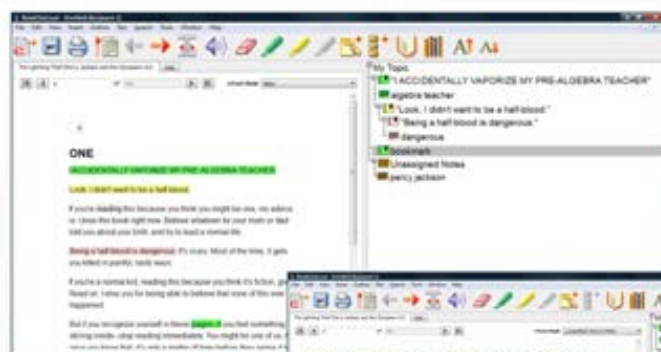
## Opened Book in ROL
