

Alignment of HUNE Youth Programs to Pennsylvania Core Standards: Overcoming Graduation Barriers



Hispanos Unidos para Niños Excepcionales (HUNE) Mission

HUNE empowers and supports parents of children and youth with exceptionalities in obtaining a quality public education, so that the students will lead rich, active lives and attain future success.

HUNE's Youth Programs

HUNE has developed their youth programs with the Pennsylvania State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP) goal of improved graduation rate for students with disabilities. These educational opportunities include an After-School Program that operates during the school year and a Summer Program. The Youth Programs use several interventions to assist students in overcoming challenges associated with their disabilities in order to increase graduation outcomes. The primary HUNE Youth Programs interventions used to assist students consist of individual/family counseling, trainings for families, community/school outreach, and secondary transition.

The Youth Programs foster collaborative relationships with students' principals, teachers, and special education professionals within charter schools and the School District of Philadelphia. HUNE works with school staff to provide extra supports such as homework assistance and counseling with the student or students' family to focus on core challenges affecting students who are in need of interventions. HUNE finds that working together as a team, comprised of the student, the student's family, and school personnel, allows for a more integrated system of communication to develop over time. This practice has proven to be one of the major strengths in helping students with disabilities overcome the challenges they face in maintaining satisfactory academic performance, resulting in higher graduation rates.

Summer and After-school Youth Programs

The mission of HUNE's After-School and Summer Youth Programs is to empower youth 14 to 21 years of age to stay in school, graduate, and become contributing members of society.

The goals of the programs are aligned to the Pennsylvania State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP) by including the following outcomes:

- Increase on-track factors that impact high school graduation (i.e., attendance, behavior, and course performance)
- Create a safe, culturally responsive place for students with and without disabilities
- Improve students' social skills
- Increase participation within the community
- Increase school retention
- Increase the level of graduation rates

Program Activities Align to Pennsylvania Core Standards

HUNE mentors have received professional development on aligning their program activities to the Pennsylvania Core Standards and the Pennsylvania English Language Proficiency Standards to ensure that the students being served are receiving an appropriate education. Youth Program mentors are in constant communication with charter schools and the School District of Philadelphia and use the students' IEP goals to plan their HUNE program activities.
