Dear Dr. Parka:

I am writing to you concerning an issue that was called to the attention of the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) after it reviewed the California Statewide Single Audit Report for fiscal year (FY 96). Specifically, OSEP is concerned about the audit report finding number 96-13-2 questioning the California State Department of Education's (CDE) use of funds under the "Grants to States for the Education of Children with Disabilities" to pay attorneys' fees of the parents or guardians of children with disabilities suing the State in the cases of *Lacayo*, *et al. V. Honig*, *et al.* and *Crawford*, *et al. v. Honig*, *et al.*

The final regulations for Part B of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, which cook effect earlier this year, make clear -- at 34 C.F.R. 300.513 -- that funds awarded under that program cannot be used to pay attorneys' fees. CDE should take appropriate steps to ensure that it does not violate this provision in the future.
